Embracing uncertAinty wHile fighting for sustainable development



This new Erasmus+ project was developed from the need to promote AN INNOVATIVE APPROACH TO ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY AND CLIMATE CHANGE STARTING FROM SECONDARY SCHOOL EDUCATIONS AND ACTIVE PEDAGOGIES. EArTH is a cooperation partnership between 6 European countries that is planned to last over 24 months, starting from the 1st December 2021.

Aims

- Provide an innovative methodology and "ready-to-use" learning material to support European secondary schools tackle Climate Change and Sustainability education.
- Utilize active pedagogies, inquiry-based learning and project-based learning, to promote Science and Circular Economy.
- Incorporate circular economy challenges into the curriculum in order to engage students and help them understand the role of STEM subjects in saving our planet.

 Activity (LTTA) will be organized




Target Groups

On the 5th of May 2022 the project partners met online for the 1st official TPM. During the meeting, the partners got to know each other and discussed issues related to the project management and project activities.










